
This summer intensive is an introduction to the foundations of the internationally recognized Ballet technique originated by Italian Ballet Master, Enrico Cecchetti (Cecchetti worked with Diaghlev at the Ballet Russe and trained world renowned dancers such as Anna Pavlova, and Vaslav Nijinsky.) The Cecchetti ballet method is classic in its purity and clear-cut style. It is a thorough method of teaching that pays careful attention to the laws of anatomy. It develops all the qualities essential to the dancer: balance, strength, elasticity, and poise.

Students develop strength and stability with a concentration on the coordination of head, arms, legs and body. The Cecchetti method teaches students the foundations of ballet theory, how the body moves through space with clarity, suppleness and grace. Emphasis is on the development of musicality and quality of movement.

Erika Schmidt is a certified instructor of the Cecchetti method through the advanced level and a member of the Cecchetti Council of America. Erika received her formal dance training in the Chicago area with Pirkko Lawlor, Anida Sedala and Gus Giordano. She has been teaching ballet and theatrical dance for 30 years and has been guest teacher and choreographer for numerous academic institutions and theater companies. Erika is artistic director for Vital Spark North, an interdisciplinary performance company that has produced projects at dance festivals, art and theater venues throughout the U.S. and Europe. www.vitalsparknorth.com


